We will continue to address Multiple Intelligences throughout the year. It is a practical way of acknowledging the many different ways a student learns. At the end of the 8th grade year, students choose the intelligence they are strongest in and are recognized for that strength during the ceremony.

Last Friday afternoon we met with our prayer partners to construct a neuron with yarn, pom-poms, beads and construction paper. The next activity in our Brian Symposium will be to design a brain cap naming the four lobes of the cerebrum: The Parietal Lobe, The Frontal Lobe, The Temporal Lobe and The Occipital Lobe.
